General Policy

The biblical and philosophical goal of Anchorage Christian Schools is to develop students into mature, Christlike individuals who will exhibit a Christlike life. Of necessity, this involves the school's understanding and belief of what qualities or characteristics exemplify a Christlike life. Even though parents and/or students may personally believe differently, while enrolled at Anchorage Christian Schools, all students are expected to exhibit the qualities of a Christlike life espoused and taught by the school and to refrain from certain activities or behaviors.

Students are expected to abide by these standards of conduct from the time they are accepted into the school. This includes school time, summertime, weekends, and holidays, whether at school, home, or elsewhere. Students found to be out of harmony with the ideals of work and life at ACS may be invited to withdraw whenever the administration determines that is necessary.
